Re: Urgent Enforcement of President Donald J. Trump's Executive Order Separating Biological Males from Actual Women in Federal Prisons – DOJ Resistance in Texas Case and Support for Attorney Barry Arrington's Parallel Efforts

Dear Attorney General Bondi:

As President of Public Advocate of the United States, I write to urge you to immediately direct the Department of Justice to cease all opposition to the separation of biological males from biological females in our federal prison system.

President Donald J. Trump's executive order issued in January 2025 could not be clearer: men who claim to be women must be removed from women's prisons to protect actual female inmates from humiliation, privacy violations, sexual assault, and violence.

Yet your Department's actions in a high-profile federal case are directly undermining that order.

Just weeks ago, U.S. District Judge Sidney Fitzwater in the Northern District of Texas issued a landmark Temporary Restraining Order in the case involving female inmates at the Federal Medical Center Carswell in Fort Worth. The order prohibits housing biological male inmates in the general female population or allowing them access to female-only areas such as showers, restrooms, changing areas, and dormitories. This is a tremendous victory for women's safety and dignity—the first federal court ruling explicitly requiring sex-based segregation in a women's prison.

The bad news, however, is shocking: the Department of Justice, through the local United States Attorney, is fighting this commonsense protection tooth and nail. Acting U.S. Attorney Nancy Larson has opposed the plaintiffs on procedural grounds under the Prison Litigation

Reform Act, arguing the female inmates have “no likelihood of prevailing on the merits.” This is despite years of documented abuses—including male inmates (some convicted sex offenders and murderers) engaging in sexual activity in women’s showers, sharing cells naked with female inmates, and impregnating women.

This resistance has received national media attention, including coverage in National Review. Given the prominence of the case and President Donald J. Trump’s explicit executive order, it is difficult to believe senior leadership at the Department of Justice is unaware.

If lower-level staff are acting without authorization, they must be reined in immediately. If this opposition is sanctioned at higher levels, that is even more alarming and demands your personal intervention.

I attach for your review the National Review article detailing the Texas TRO and the DOJ’s opposition. I also attach the Motion for Preliminary Injunction filed by attorney Barry Arrington on behalf of plaintiff Meshel T. Sirio in the parallel Colorado state case (Sirio v. Polis, et al., No. 25-cv-2790).

Mr. Arrington’s client—a biological female inmate—is being forced to share cells, restrooms, and intimate spaces with biological males, including a convicted murderer who brutally stabbed a woman to death and now demands to be housed as “female.” The motion lays bare the Orwellian refusal of officials to enforce plain statutory language: “Male and female prisoners... shall not be put or kept in the same room.”

Public Advocate stands firmly with Barry Arrington in his courageous fight to protect women in prison. His work exposes the same dangerous policies now being defended by elements of the DOJ in federal facilities. Women prisoners are not experimental subjects for gender ideology. They are daughters, mothers, and sisters entitled to basic safety and privacy under the law and under President Trump’s clear directive.


Attorney General Bondi, the American people elected President Donald J. Trump to restore sanity and safety. We expect the Department of Justice under your leadership to enforce his executive order without hesitation or procedural gamesmanship.

Please confirm that you will promptly instruct all U.S. Attorneys and DOJ personnel to stop opposing sex-segregated housing in federal women’s prisons, support the Texas court’s TRO, and align fully with the President’s policy of protecting actual women from men in their living spaces.

I respectfully request a written response within 14 days outlining the steps the Department will take. The eyes of the nation—and especially the women trapped in these facilities—are upon you.

Thank you for your immediate attention to this critical matter of women's safety.
